Europol: staff regulations, amendments. Initiative Ireland

2004/0804(CNS) - 09/03/2004 - Text adopted by Parliament, 1st reading/single reading

The European Parliament rejected by 54 votes in favour, 411 against and 43 abstentions three initiatives of Ireland for Council Decisions adjusting the Europol staff regulations and basic salaries. (Please also see CNS/2004/0805 and CNS/2004/0806.) The rapporteur was Maurizio TURCO (Ind, Italy). Europol: staff regulations, amendments. Initiative Ireland

2004/0804(CNS) - 28/01/2004 - Legislative proposal

PURPOSE : to adopt a Council Act which aims to amend Europol's staff regulations to improve the travel policy. PROPOSED ACT : Council Act (Initiative of Ireland). CONTENT : having regard to the Convention on the establishment of a European police Office (Europol Convention), this draft initiative aims to amend the Staff Regulation applicable to Europol employees in order to improve the travel policy. It is of the Council, acting unanimously, to lay down the detailed arrangements applicable to Europol employees. It is proposed to amend the Staff Regulation to stipulate that Europol may, after consulting the Staff Committee, take out an additional sickness insurance which shall be compulsory for all officials. The full contribution required to meet this additional insurance cover shall be charged to the official. In addition, the draft initiative proposes that an official travelling on official business (a mission) and holding an appropriate authorisation shall be entitled to the reimbursement of mission expenses. Moreover, the authorisation shall state the probable duration of the mission, on the basis of which shall be calculated any advance which the official may draw against the subsistence allowance and travel and accommodation costs. Any contribution, whether in kind or financial, received from a third party in connection with a mission shall be declared to Europol by the official concerned. Such contributions shall be deducted from the reimbursement to which the official would otherwise be entitled. Acting on a proposal of the Director, the Management Board shall lay down detailed rules on mission expenses and the reimbursement thereof.

Europol: staff regulations, amendments. Initiative Ireland

2004/0804(CNS) - 29/04/2004 - Final act

PURPOSE : to amend Europol's staff regulations to improve the travel policy.

LEGISLATIVE ACT : Council Act 2004/C114/02 amending Europol's staff regulations.

CONTENT : The main points of this act are as follows:

- Europol may take out an additional sickness insurance which will be compulsory for all officials. The full contribution required to meet this additional insurance cover will be charged to the official;
- An official travelling on official business and holding an appropriate authorisation is entitled to the reimbursement of mission expenses;
- The authorisation must state the probable duration of the mission, on the basis of which will be calculated any advance which the official may draw against the subsistence allowance and travel and accommodation costs;
- Any contribution received from a third party in connection with a mission must be declared to Europol by the official concerned, and will be deducted from the reimbursement to which the official would otherwise be entitled;
- Acting on a proposal of the Director, the Management Board acting by a majority of two thirds of its members, must lay down detailed rules on mission expenses and reimbursement.

ENTRY INTO FORCE : 30/04/2004.
