Submission by Member States of statistics on aquaculture production

OBJECTIVE: the regulation proposes to make formal arrangements for the submission to the Commission of statistical data on aquaculture production using harmonised definitions. SUBSTANCE: - Each Member State shall submit annually to the Commission statistics on the aquaculture production in all waters of that Member State; the data shall be forwarded within nine months of the end of the calendar year to which they refer; - The data may be submitted on magnetic medium, the format of such submission being agreed between the Member State and the Commission; - The Member State may use sample surveys or other relevant sources; a Member State having a total annual production of less than 1 000 tonnes may submit estimates for its total production; - The Commission may fix a transitional period up to a maximum of three years during which the full implementation of the regulation is to be achieved. During this transitional period, temporary derogations exempting a Member State from provisions of this regulation may be accorded; such derogations shall be for a maximum of three years but may be extended by further three-year periods. ?

Submission by Member States of statistics on aquaculture production

A report by James PROVAN (EPP, UK) was unanimously adopted supporting a Commission proposal to improve the quality of aquaculture statistics available at a Community level. The measures which require no additional expenditure, involve the harmonisation of definitions employed by the Member States in the submission of data and will allow the Commission to make information available at the Union level to such organisations as the FAO. A transitional period of up to three years may be used by Member States which are not in a position to implement all the provisions of the Regulation immediately. Several drafting amendments were adopted by the Committee in order to improve the clarity of the Commission's text.

Submission by Member States of statistics on aquaculture production

By adopting the report by Mr James L.C. Provan (PPE, UK), Parliament approved the Commission proposal to improve the standard of aquaculture production statistics and made five technical amendments intended to clarify the text. ?

Submission by Member States of statistics on aquaculture production
