# Agricultural prices 1996/1997: flax and hemp, common organisation of the market COM

Agricultural prices and related measures 1996/97 - Fibre flax. Because of the desirability of more stability in the flax market and in the areas sown, the Commission proposes a regime providing for a Community maximum guaranteed area (MGA) based on average area cultivated over the last three years (81 500 ha) to be applied from the 1997/98 marketing year. In case of overshoot, a reduction in the aid (1% for an overrun of each 1% of the MGA) for the marketing year concerned will apply. In order to avoid the effect of the MGA bearing disproportionately on producers practising traditional production techniques, it is proposed to introduce, as of the 1997/98 marketing year, an aid abatement to be applied to the aid paid to those producers who harvest their crops by cutting rather by grubbing up their crops. The level of the abatement, to be set by the Commission (management committee procedure), will take account of the variable costs and values of output of the two systems as well as the need to avoid encouraging the non-traditional producers to invest in the traditional intensive production techniques. This new abatement would replace the existing abatements based on yields of seed. The new system will be reviewed after three years to verify whether it has allowed the objective of maintaining a balance between the traditional and less intensive techniques to be attained. ?

## Agricultural prices 1996/1997: flax and hemp, common organisation of the market COM

In adopting the report by Mr Giacomo SANTINI (UPE, I), the European Parliament called for measures to encourage the use of agricultural products for non-food purposes since fibre plants were especially suitable for this purpose. Moreover, it proposed increasing the maximum guaranteed area from 81 500 hectares (Commission proposal) to 103 000 hectares and modifying the system for reducing aid where the MGA was exceeded by applying additional reductions in the Member States concerned. ?
