Agricultural prices 1996/1997: sheepmeat and goatmeat (amend. regul. 3013/89/EEC)

Agricultural prices and related measures 1996/97 - Sheepmeat and goatmeat. With the aim of making the private storage procedure more effective, in the event that a swift intervention is required (sudden market price fall in a certain quotation zone or agreement from the Commission for a defined but limited operation), the Commission proposes to modify the basic regulations establishing the possibility to foresee at any market price level the need for private storage by means of the procedure which fixes in advance the amount of aid (the procedure by tender remaining, however, the rule to follow in the majority of cases). Under these conditions, a single management committee could, if necessary, vote without unnecessary delay on the amount they judge to be adequate and on the maximum acceptable quantity to be put into storage within a certain deadline. An extension of the derogation granted to the new German Länder as regards the application of the limit of the ewe premia is also proposed. ?

In adopting the report by Mr Giacomo SANTINI (UPE, I), the European Parliament approved an increase of a further 10% compared to the Commission proposal for the unit amount of the premium for the female animals of mountain breeds (from 70% to 80%). ?

Agricultural prices and related measures 1996/97 - sheepmeat and goatmeat. COMMUNITY MEASURE: Council Regulation (EC) 1589/96 amending Regulation (EEC) No 3013/89 on the common organization of the market in sheepmeat and goatmeat. SUBSTANCE: In order to increase the effectiveness of the private storage procedure, where a rapid intervention is found to be necessary, amendment of the basic regulation opens up the possibility, regardless of the market price level, of laying down the conditions for private storage provided there is a procedure fixing the amount of aid in advance. In addition, the derogation granted to the new German Länder as regards the application of the maximum number of ewe premiums is extended until the year 2000. Unused rights to the premium will be entirely allocated to the reserve. ENTRY INTO FORCE: 19 August 1996. ?
