# EC/Sao Tome e Principe fisheries agreement: protocol for the period from 1st June 1995 to 31st May 1999

OBJECTIVE: under the existing Agreement between the Community and Sao Tomé and Principe, the fishing opportunities available to the Community fleet and the financial compensation allocated to Sao Tomé and Principe are the subject of periodically renewed protocols. Since the last protocol has now expired, the present text renews the protocol for the period 1 June 1996-31 May 1999. SUBSTANCE: the fishing opportunities opened up under this Protocol primarily concern Spanish, French and Portuguese fishermen. The proposal for a Council Decision allocates fishing opportunities among the three fleets as follows: - France: fishing licences for 18 freezer tuna seiners and 7 tuna canning vessels; - Spain: licences for 19 freezer tuna seiners and 20 surface longliners; - Portugal: licences for 5 surface longliners. In return for these fishing opportunities, the financial compensation provided to Sao Tomé and Principe is ECU 1.8 m, which covers an annual weight of catch of 9 000 tonnes. The following are added to this compensation: - the EC contribution to the financing of scientific and technical programmes concerning the economic area of Sao Tomé and Principe (ECU 187.500); - the provision to the authorities of that State of scholarships and practical training in the various disciplines related to fisheries (ECU 35 000); - the contribution to the cost of international fisheries meetings (ECU 62 000); - the contribution by Sao Tomé to the Gulf of Guinea regional fisheries committee (ECU 90 000). - The Annexes to the Protocol specify the conditions for issue of licences and the obligations upon Community vessels (fee of ECU 20 per tonne fished, keeping of a fishery log book, regular reporting of their position and catches, obligation to accede to the request made by the coastal State for the boarding of observers). ?

The draft report by Mr William MACARTNEY was adopted. The report calls once again on behalf of the European Parliament for the introduction of suitable procedures for monitoring fisheries agreements, transparency and a reasonable deadline for consultation.?

In adopting the report by Mr Allan MACARTNEY (ARE, UK), the European Parliament approved the proposal for a regulation on the conclusion of a new fisheries protocol between the Community and S-o Tomé and Principe with the following amendments: -the information provided to the budgetary authority should be improved in order to facilitate the taking of decisions during the budgetary procedure, -during the final year of application of the protocol (and before the conclusion of any agreement to renew it), the Commission should submit a report to Parliament and the Council on the conditions governing the implementation of the agreement. On the basis of this report and after consulting the European Parliament, the Council may give the Commission a new mandate to negotiate on the renewal of the fisheries protocol. ?

# EC/Sao Tome e Principe fisheries agreement: protocol for the period from 1st June 1995 to 31st May 1999

OBJECTIVE: conclusion of a new Protocol on fishing between the Community and Sao Tomé e Príncipe establishing the fishing opportunities open to the Community fleets and the financial compensation provided for to S.o Tomé e Príncipe for the period 1 June 1996 to 31 May 1999. COMMUNITY MEASURE: Council Regulation (EC) No 1130/97 on the conclusion of the Protocol establishing the fishing opportunities and the financial contribution provided for in the Agreement between the European Community and the Government of the Democratic Republic of So Tomé e Príncipe on fishing off the coast of Sao Tomé e Príncipe for the period 1 June 1996 to 31 May 1999. SUBSTANCE: the fishing possibilities opened under this Protocol mainly concern the fishermen of Spain, France and Portugal. The Regulation sets the allocation of fishing possibilities between these three fleets as follows: - France: fishing licences for 18 freezer tuna seiners and 7 pole-and-line tuna vessels; - Spain: licences for 19 freezer tuna seiners and 20 surface long-liners; - Portugal: licences for 5 surface long-liners. In exchange for these fishing possibilities the financial compensation offered to S·o Tomé e Príncipe is ECU 1.8 million, which covers an annual catch of 9 000 tonnes. In addition to this compensation there is: - Community participation in the financing of scientific and technical programmes as regard the exclusive economic zone of S·o Tomé e Príncipe amounting to ECU 187 500; - the making available to the authorities of that state awards for study and practical training in the various disciplines relating to fisheries (ECU 35 000); - participation in the costs of international meetings on fisheries (ECU 62 000); - bearing the costs of the participation by Sao Tomé e Príncipe in the Regional Fisheries Committee for the Gulf of Guinea (up to ECU 90 000). The Annex to the Protocol sets out the conditions for the issue of licences and the obligations on Community vessels (fee of ECU 20 per tonne caught, keeping of a fishing log, regular communication of their position and their catches, requirement to comply with the request by the coastal state to allow on board observers). ENTRY INTO FORCE: the Regulation entered into force on 24 June 1997. As the protocol was initialled by the parties on 23 May 1996, it will enter into force as soon as all the necessary notifications have been completed.?
