## EP Rules of procedure, rule 156: right of petition

The committee adopted unanimously the proposal for a decision amending Rule 156 of the Rules of Procedure on the right of petition. The proposal by the rapporteur, Mr Sören Wibe (PSE, S), sought to allow the submission of petitions via electronic media and provided, inter alia, for the introduction of a public register in which all petitions which had not been submitted in confidence would be entered. ?

## EP Rules of procedure, rule 156: right of petition

In adopting the report by Mr Sören WIBE (PSE, S) Parliament amended Rule 156 of its Rules of Procedure. This Rule sets out the conditions which must be met for submission of a petition to the European Parliament. The amendments seek only to provide additional details so that unless the person submitting the petition asks for it to be treated in confidence, the petition is to be entered in a public register. ?
