## Agricultural prices 1997/1998: monthly increases for paddy rice

Agricultural prices 1997/98 - paddy rice - Price: the intervention price for paddy rice for the marketing years 1996/97 to 1999/2000 was set by the Council when the reform of the common organization of the markets was adopted at ECU 333.45 per tonne for the 1997/98 marketing year. - Monthly increases: in view of the fall in interest rates it is proposed that the monthly increase for the 1997/98 marketing year should be set at ECU 2 per tonne (as opposed to ECU 2.28 per tonne for the previous marketing year). ?

## Agricultural prices 1997/1998: monthly increases for paddy rice

Agricultural prices 1997/1998 - Paddy rice Adopting the report by Mr Robert STURDY (PPE, UK), Parliament called for the monthly increases to be maintained at ECU 2.28 per tonne for the intervention price (the Commission proposed reducing them to ECU 2 per tonne). It also pointed out the need to respect Community preferences but also to confirm the continuation of the current system for advance fixing of import levies. ?

## Agricultural prices 1997/1998: monthly increases for paddy rice

Agricultural prices 1997/1998 - Paddy rice. Adopting Regulation (EC) No 1413/97, the Council decided to reduce the monthly increases from ECU 2.28 per tonne to ECU 2.00 per tonne. It should be noted that the Council called on the Commission to examine whether Member States could introduce regional sub-divisions of the national maximum guaranteed area in the organization of the rice market, which has recently

been reformed. The Council asked the Commission to submit a proposal which seeks to include rice seeds in the CMO of rice so that they are eligible for the payments introduced when the sector was reformed in order to compensate for the reduction in the intervention price, and to modify Regulation (EC) No 2358/71 on the CMO of seeds in order to introduce a mechanism to stabilize the level of production which qualifies for seed aid for each Member State.?
