Agricultural Prices 1998/1999 - Arable crops. In the framework of the 1997/98 price package, the Council decided that, from 1998/99 onwards, Member States must inform producers of the application of sub base areas, allowing them to target the penalties for base area overshoots to the regions responsible, by 15 May at the latest. In the light of experience in 1997, the Commission proposes to fix the deadline for informing producers at 15 September instead of 15 May. ?

In adopting the report by Mr Edouard des PLACES (I-EDN, F), the European Parliament calls for a proposal on compulsory set-aside to be tabled without delay so that a decision can be taken by 30 June 1998. It also calls for: - suspension of the extraordinary set-aside on overshoots of one of the base areas applicable in the marketing years 1998/1999 and 1999/2000; - the extension by two years of the transitional period applicable to the new Länder turning the application of base areas; - the payment of compensation of ECU 75 instead of ECU 69 at present for industrial set-aside.?

Agricultural prices 1998/99 - Arable crops (support system for producers) COMMUNITY MEASURE: Council Regulation (EC) 1624/98 amending regulation (EEC) 1765/92 SUBSTANCE: the Council decided to set 15 September instead of 15 May as the deadline for notifying producers. The Member States are authorised to pay national aid of up to 50% of the costs associated with establishing multiannual crops intended for biomass production on set-aside land. When the fallow area is used for multi annual crops intended for biomass production, the Member States may authorise producers to set aside an area greater than that intended for arable crops for which a compensatory payment is requested. It was decided to extend by 12 months the period of 60 months during which producers which have set aside land may continue to do so. ?
