Fisheries, Inter-American tropical tuna Commission ICCAT: temporary adhesion of Spain to the Convention

PURPOSE: temporary accession of the Kingdom of Spain to the Convention establishing the Inter-American Tropical Tuna Commission. CONTENT: The Inter-American Tropical Tuna Commission (IATTC) is a regional fisheries organisation responsible for the central eastern Pacific. Since fishing activites are carried out in this geographical area by the Community fleet, and currently by Spanish vessels, the Community is negotiating to join the IATTC. However, it would appear that accession will not be possible in the near future, mainly because the IATTC statutes will have to be amended to permit the accession of regional organisations pursuing economic integration, such as the European Community. To defend the interests of the Community fleet, therefore, Spain has applied to join the IATTC on a temporary basis as a sovereign state, until the European Community becomes a member. In view of Spain's commitments above all to recognise Community competence on issues relating to regional fisheries organisations and withdrawals effective from the date of Community accession to the IATTC, its request should, exceptionally, be approved by the Council. For this reason, the Commission proposes that the Council should adopt this draft decision.?

Under consultation procedure without debate, the European Parliament adopted the report by Carmen Fraga Estévez (PPE,ES), which approves the Commission proposal for a Council decision authorising the Kingdom of Spain to accede to the Convention establishing the Inter-American Tropical Tuna Commission on a temporary basis.?

PURPOSE: to authorise the Kingdom of Spain to accede to the Convention establishing the Inter-American Tropical Tuna Commission on a temporary basis. COMMUNITY MEASURE: Council decision 1999/405/EC. CONTENT: the Inter-American Tropical Tuna Commission (IATTC) is a regional fisheries organisation with competence in the Central-Eastern Pacific. In the context of the fishing activities undertaken in that geographical zone by the Community fleet, currently comprised of Spanish vessels, the Community has been negotiating its accession to the IATTC. However, it appears unlikely that the Community's accession will take place in the near future. As a result, and in order that the interests of the Community fleet are represented within the IATTC, the Community is, as an exceptional measure, authorising the Kingdom of Spain to accede to the IATTC on a temporary basis, until the Community becomes a member. Spain's participation in the decisions of the IATTC must be undertaken in line with the Community position and in close consultation with the Commission. The Commission will then subsequently report to the European Parliament and the Council on the decisions taken in the IATTC. ENTRY INTO FORCE: 10/06/1999.
