### EC/Equatorial Guinea fisheries agreement: protocol from 1st July 2000 to 30 June 2001

PURPOSE : to conclude the Protocol establishing for the period 01.07.00 to 30.06.01 the fishing rights and financial compensation provided for in the Agreement between the European Economic Community and the Government of the Republic of Equatorial Guinea on fishing off the coast of Equatorial Guinea. CONTENT : the Protocol to the Fisheries Agreement between the EC and Equatorial Guinea expired on 30.06.00. The Parties have decided to extend the Protocol by one year. The new Protocol was signed by both Parties on 16.6.2000 and fixes the technical and financial conditions governing the fishing activities of Community vessels in the waters of Equatorial Guinea during the period 1.7.2000 to 30.6.2001.?

The committee adopted the report by Pat the Cope GALLAGHER (UEN, IRL) broadly approving the conclusion of the Protocol, subject to a few amendments. It wanted the Commission to forward to Parliament and Council a copy of the annual report on the implementation of targeted measures which the Equatorial Guinean authorities were required to draw up under the Protocol. It also called on the Commission to submit to Parliament and Council, before the start of negotiations to renew the Protocol, a general assessment report including a cost benefit analysis. The Council would authorise the Commission to start negotiations only on the basis of that report and Parliament's opinion thereon. The committee pointed out that these amendments were in line with the position taken by Parliament on several other fisheries agreements. ?

The European Parliament adopted the report by Mr Pat the Cope GALLAGHER (UEN, Ire) in relation to the conclusion of the Protocol establishing for the period 1 July 2000 to 30 June 2001 the fishing rights and financial compensation provided for in the Agreement between the European Economic Community and the Government of the Republic of Equatorial Guinea on fishing off the coast of Equatorial Guinea. MEPs are however anxious to see a proper fisheries management scheme in place for waters surrounding Equatorial Guinea in order to ensure that tuna stocks are not over exploited. Non-binding amendments seeking to ensure an evaluation of the Agreement to include the costs and benefits were therefore approved. ?

## EC/Equatorial Guinea fisheries agreement: protocol from 1st July 2000 to 30 June 2001

PURPOSE: to conclude a Protocol establishing for the period 01.08.2000 to 30.06.2001 the fishing rights and financial compensation provided for in the Agreement between the European Economic Community and the Government of the Republic of Equatorial Guinea on fishing off the coast of Equatorial Guinea. COMMUNITY MEASURE: Council Regulation 723/2001/EC CONTENT: The fishing opportunities provided for in the Protocol shall be allocated among the Member States as follows: a) tuna seiners: - France 19 vessels - Spain 10 vessels - Italy 1 vessel b) surface longliners: - Spain 25 vessels - Portugal 5 vessels c) pole-and-line tuna vessels - France 8 vessels. If licence applications from those Member States do not exhaust the fishing opportunities provided for in the Protocol, the Commission may consider licence applications from any other Member State. ENTRY INTO FORCE: 15.04.2001.?
