Combating Aids, tuberculosis and malaria: Community contribution to the Global Fund

PURPOSE : to provide a legal base for the European Community's contribution to the Global Fund to fight HIV/AIDS, tuberculosis and malaria. CONTENT : The Global fund, set up by the United Nations, is intended to establish an innovative public/private partnership and fund to tackle these three distinct diseases. The Commission recommends that a contribution of EUR 120 million be made to the Global Fund, of which EUR 60 million comes from the European Community budget and EUR 60 million from the EDF. The contribution from the budget covers the years 2001 and 2002. EUR 50 million will be transferred from the Fisheries budget line and EUR 10 million from the ALA budgetlines. The European Community's contribution will be drawn from budget-line B7-6211 (poverty related diseases, in particular tuberculosis and malaria). This will require a transfer within Heading 4 of the financial perspectives.?

Combating Aids, tuberculosis and malaria: Community contribution to the Global Fund

The committee adopted the report by Joaquim MIRANDA (EUL/NGL, P) amending the proposal under the codecision procedure (1st reading). The committee wanted a legal base to be established for the Community's subsequent contributions, to be made annually. It urged the Commision to ensure that Parliament was kept properly informed, and called on it to submit to Parliament and Council in 2002 an initial report on the Fund's management and working methods.?

Combating Aids, tuberculosis and malaria: Community contribution to the Global Fund

The European parliament adopted the report by Joaquim MIRANDA (EUL/NGL, P) concerning the European Community contribution to the Global Fund to fight HIV/AIDS, Tuberculosis and Malaria. The aim of the proposal being for the Community to make a contribution of EUR 60 million in 2001 from the Community budget. This contribution will be managed alongside the other contributions to the Global Fund in accordance with the principles of sound and efficient management. The Commission should propose a legal basis for future contributions for the implementation of the Programme for Action on the three communicable diseases, including any further contributions to the Global Fund. Moreover, in 2002, the Commission shall submit to the European Parliament and the Council a first report on management and working methods of the Global Fund. From 2003 on, reporting on the implementation of the Programme for Action including the Global Fund shall be part of the Community's annual report on external assistance.?

PURPOSE : to establish the European Community's contribution to the Global Fund. COMMUNITY MEASURE : Decision 36/2002/EC of the European Parliament and of the Council concerning the Community contribution to the Global Fund to fight HIV/AIDS, tuberculosis and malaria. CONTENT : The UN Secretary General proposed the establishment of a Global Fund to fight HIV/AIDS, tuberculosis and malaria. This Decision provides that the Community will contribute EUR 60 million for 2001. The contribution will be made by means of a financing agreement to be concluded between the Commission and the Trustee of the Global Fund. In 2002 the Commission will submit to Parliament and Council a first report on the governance and working methods of the Global Fund. From 2003, reporting the implementation of the Programme for Action including the Global Fund shall be part of the Community's annual report on external assistance.
