The committee adopted the report by Richard CORBETT (PES, UK) on restructuring Parliament's Rules of Procedure in the form of a revised 'Contents' intended to improve the 'clarity' of the text and make it easier to use. The report therefore introduced a total of 12 titles subdivided into chapters. The committee also made a small number of technical and drafting amendments to some of the rules, while leaving their substantive provisions untouched.?
