Europol: adjusting the basic salaries and allowances as from july 2003. Initiative Ireland

PURPOSE: to adopt a Council Decision adjusting the basic salaries and allowances applicable to Europol staff. PROPOSED ACT: Council Decision (Initiative of Ireland). CONTENT: having regard to the Council Act of 3 December 1998 laying the Staff Regulations applicable to Europol employees and the review of remuneration of officials of Europol by the management Board of Europol, this draft initiative intends to increase the basic monthly salaries and allowances of the officials of Europol in order to take account of the changes of the costs of living in the Netherlands, as well as the changes in the salaries in the public service in the Member States. In light of this review, an increase of 3,1% of remuneration for the period between 1 July 2002 and 1 July 2003 is proposed. It is for the Council, acting unanimously, to adjust the basic salaries and allowances on the basis of the review.?

The European Parliament rejected by 54 votes in favour, 411 against and 43 abstentions three initiatives of Ireland for Council Decisions adjusting the Europol staff regulations and basic salaries. (Please also see CNS/2004/0804 and CNS/2004/0806.) The rapporteur was Maurizio TURCO (Ind, Italy). (Please refer to the previous summary setting out the reasons for the rejection of the initiatives.)?

Europol: adjusting the basic salaries and allowances as from july 2003. Initiative Ireland

PURPOSE: toincrease the basic salaries and allowances applicable to Europol staff.

LEGISLATIVE ACT: Council Decision 2004/C 114/03 adjusting the basic salaries and allowances applicable to Europol Staff.

CONTENT: In a recent review of the remuneration of officials, the Management Board took account of the changes in the cost of living in the Netherlands, as well as of the changes in salaries in the public service in the Member States. The review justifies an increase of 3.1 % of remuneration for the period between 1 July 2002 and 1 July 2003.

This Decision increases the basic salaries and allowances of officials of Europol, on the basis of the review.
