Credit insurance, credit guarantees and financial credits: consultation and information. Codified version

PURPOSE : to codify Council Decision 73/391/EEC. PROPOSED ACT : Council Decision. CONTENT : the purpose of this proposal is to undertake a codification of Council Decision 73/391/EEC of 3 December 1973 on consultation and information procedures in matters of credit insurance, credit guarantees and financial credits. The new Decision will supersede the various acts incorporated in it. This proposal fully preserves the content of the acts being codified and hence does no more than bring them together with only such formal amendments as are required by the codification exercise itself.?

CONTENT: the Council has adopted a Decision regarding the consultation and information procedures in matters of credit insurance, credit guarantees and financial credits (codified version). This Council Decision codifies provisions set out in Council Decision 73/391/EEC of 3 December 1973. The new Decision will supersede the various acts incorporated in it.

The new Decision fully preserves the content of the acts being codified and hence does no more than bring them together with only such formal amendments as are required by the codification exercise itself.
