PURPOSE: to update the agreement on Co-operation and Customs Union between the Republic of San Marino and the EU following the accession of ten new Member States. PROPOSED ACT: Council Decision. CONTENT: the Co-operation and Customs Union between the EU and the Republic of San Marino entered into force in April 2002.
