Mutual recognition of declaration and licensing procedures for provision of telecommunications services

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The amended proposal was based on a new approach that aimed to give greater weight to the principle of full mutual recognition on the basis of gradual harmonisation according to the service categories and to simplify the proposed procedures, whilst preserving the specific time limits laid down. In relation to the initial proposal, the amended proposal: - excluded from its scope voice telephony and telex services as well as satellite and mobile communications; - included the procedures allowing for the provision of telecommunications services throughout the Community on the basis of mutually recognised national authorisations or, for a transitional period, on the basis of national authorisations obtained through a one-stop shopping procedure. These procedures no longer required the introduction of the concept of a single European telecommunications licence; - provided for a procedure of mutual recognition of national authorisations for the provision of telecommunications services on the basis of harmonised national licensing regimes; - established a procedure permitting the use of the technical expertise of the national regulatory authorities by giving ECTRA mandates for the harmonisation of licensing conditions. This procedure also allowed for the mutual recognition of national authorisations for certain categories of services without prior harmonisation; - replaced the procedure permitting the recognition of authorisations on the basis of individual requests through a transitional one-stop shopping procedure that facilitated the obtention of national authorisations in cases where a telecommunications service could still not be offered through a mutually recognised authorisation. The transitional procedures provided for an appeal mechanism, accompanied by a conciliation procedure, for cases where a national authorisation was not granted within the time frame laid down by the directive; - provided for a review of the arrangements of the procedure, in light of the experience gained; - set out clear requirements regarding information (submission of an annual report by the CTC and the Member States). ?

Mutual recognition of declaration and licensing procedures for provision of telecommunications services

The Committee adopted the report by Mrs Larive on the proposal relating to the mutual recognition of licences and other national permits for the provision of telecommunications services. The proposal in question had already been amended, the previous text having been withdrawn by the Commission, as the method proposed - namely a single Community licence - was not considered to be satisfactory. In the amended proposal, the principle of the general mutual recognition of national licences using a harmonization system based on service categories has now become the primary objective of the new document. Given the complexity of the harmonization process and the time needed to achieve

such an objective, the proposal provided for a "single counter" system for the granting of licences, an arrangement which Mrs Larive fully supported. By means of such a mechanism, any potential provider would be allowed to offer his services throughout the entire territory of the Union by means of a single declaration, this scheme applying to those categories of services for which mutual recognition had not yet been gained. The main amendments adopted by the Committee concern: - the inclusion of voice telephony, telex and mobile radio services in the scope of the Directive, - the need to ensure that the process was not harmful to those already operating in this sector, - the setting-up of a European Telecommunications Authority whose role would be to ensure that the minimum regulations required at European level were being applied, - the need to make more transparent and more equitable the conciliation procedure relating to disputes between service providers and national regulatory authorities, - matters relating to third-country service providers and the need to take account of the principle of reciprocity and the extent to which the markets in the country of origin of the said providers were opened-up. ?

Mutual recognition of declaration and licensing procedures for provision of telecommunications services

Parliament approved the proposal subject to certain amendments relating to the following: - the inclusion of voice telephony and telex services in the scope of the Directive; - the need to ensure that the process was not harmful to those already operating in this sector and would not create increased bureaucracy; - the setting up of a European Telecommunications Authority with a mandate to apply European legislation on telecommunications (on the basis of a proposal which the Commission would present by 1.01.1997); - the need to make more transparent and equitable the conciliation procedure relating to disputes between service providers and the national regulatory authorities (participation of telecommunications operators and service providers in the work of the conciliation group, alongside the members of the CTC and, in certain cases, independent experts); - issues relating to third-country service providers and the need to take account of the principle of reciprocity and the extent to which the markets in the country of origin of the said service provider were opened-up; - the need for those bodies closely associated with the procedure for the harmonization of conditions for the granting of licences, namely the CTC and ECTRA, to submit annual reports to the Commission, the Council and Parliament on the work carried out within the context of the Directive. ?
