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## Common Information Technology Security Evaluation Criteria

This proposal for a recommendation of the Council suggested: - the adoption of common information technology security evaluation criteria within evaluation and certification schemes for an initial period of two years; - the advancement, under the auspices of a Senior Officials Group for Security of Information Systems, of international harmonisation and standardisation of information technology security evaluation criteria; - a review of developments after this initial period and the proposal of actions in the light of experience and the results of the international harmonisation.?

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## Common Information Technology Security Evaluation Criteria

Parliament adopted the report by Mr Fernand Herman. It approved the Commission proposal with an amendment (paragraph 2 bis) calling for negotiations to be opened with the United States on the mutual recognition of standards between the Community and the United States. ?

The amended proposal incorporates the amendment adopted by the European Parliament.

## Common Information Technology Security Evaluation Criteria

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The Council recommended: - the application of the common information technology security evaluation criteria (ITSEC) within evaluation and certification schemes for an initial period of two years; - advancing, under the auspices of the Senior Officials Group on the Security of Information Systems (SOG-IS), international harmonisation and standardisation of information technology security evaluation criteria; - the negotiation by the Member States during the initial period or, if necessary, until international harmonisation and standardisation was agreed, of bilateral and preferably European or international mutual recognition of security evaluation certificates; - reviewing developments after this initial period and proposing appropriate actions in the light of experience and the results of the international harmonisation. ?
