Objectives and strategies for the management of certain fishing grounds for the period 1994-1997

The aim of this proposal was to define management targets and corresponding strategies for certain fisheries or groups of fisheries for the period 1994-1997: replenishment of stocks under threat (e.g. round fish); preventing the deterioration of stocks which were better off by restricting fishing activity or, in some cases (e.g. Norway lobster), by directly controlling the activity; greater protection for juvenile fish; a monitoring system to follow how the situation developed over the four years in question.?

The sub-committee on fisheries adopted the report by Mr VASQUEZ FOUZ, calling for research programmes to determine the size of stocks and mortality rates. As the rapporteur pointed out, the acquisition of reliable information is an objective in itself. In addition, Mr VASQUEZ FOUZ stressed the importance of the fishermen themselves and the need to accompany restrictions on fishing activity with simultaneous monitoring and socio-economic measures.

?Working on the basis of the Council conclusions of 28 September 1994, the Council held a thorough-going discussion of medium--term objectives, recognising their importance for resource management. The Council observed that objectives and strategies needed to be examined together, giving due weight to socio-economic factors and multiannual guidance programmes, and agreed on the need to continue discussions on all aspects, including the legal form of the instrument. However, the Council agrees that special attention should be paid, both now and when TACs and quotas are fixed at the end of the year, to the highly sensitive stocks identified by the Commission, of which the Council has taken good note. The Council therefore calls on the Commission to ensure that scientific experts monitor the development of these stocks particularly carefully and to report back on its work.?
