EC/Equatorial Guinea fisheries agreement: protocol for the period from 1st July 1994 to 30 June 1997

This proposal aimed to conclude a new fisheries protocol between the Community and Equatorial Guinea. It laid down the technical and financial conditions covering fishing activities of Community vessels in waters of Equatorial Guinea between 1 July 1994 and 30 June 1997. The protocol thus provided for the following fisheries opportunities: - licences for 47 freezer tuna seiners; - licences for 4 pole-and-line tuna vessels; - licences for 2 surface longliners. In return, Equatorial Guinea would be granted: - financial compensation totalling ECU 412 500, payable in three equal annual instalments, covering a catch weight in waters of Equatorial Guinea of 2 750 tonnes per year. If the annual catch exceeded this quantity, the total compensation would be increased proportionately; - a contribution of ECU 120 000 towards the financing of scientific or technical programmes to develop the fisheries industry; - awards for study and practical training to improve the skills and knowledge of fishermen, to a maximum of ECU 127 500. ?

EC/Equatorial Guinea fisheries agreement: protocol for the period from 1st July 1994 to 30 June 1997

The report by Mr SUANZES-CARPEGNA was adopted by the Committee on Fisheries according to the procedure under Rule 52 of Parliament's Rules of Procedure (delegation of the power of decision to committees). In his report, Mr SUANZES-CARPEGNA called on the Commission to submit a detailed report to Parliament before 15 May each year on the application of this agreement and to submit a report on the implementing conditions of the agreement during the last year of its validity (and before the conclusion of any new agreement to renew the latter). On the basis of this report, and after prior consultation of the EP, the Council would authorise the Commission to negotiate on its behalf the implementing protocols for the fisheries agreement. ?

EC/Equatorial Guinea fisheries agreement: protocol for the period from 1st July 1994 to 30 June 1997

Procedure (delegation of the power of decision to committees), subject to the following amendments: - the Commission should submit a detailed report to Parliament before 15 May each year on the application of this agreement; - the Commission should submit a report to the EP (and to the Council) on the application and implementing conditions of the agreement during the last year of its validity (and before the conclusion of its renewal). On the basis of this report, and after prior consultation of the EP, the Council would authorise the Commission to negotiate on its behalf the implementing protocol for the EC/Equatorial Guinea fisheries agreement. ?

The protocol would apply from 1 July 1994 and enter into force on the date of its signature. The Council was authorised to designate the persons empowered to sign the protocol in order to bind the Community. The regulation would apply from 3 August 1995. ?
