EP Rules of procedure, rule 52: delegation of the power of decision to a committee

The European Parliament decided to make the following amendment to its Rules of Procedure (Rule 52, paragraph 5: delegation of decision-making powers to a committee): the resolution and any amendments made to a report presented by the parliamentary committee to which decision-making powers have been delegated will be deemed to have been adopted and entered in the minutes unless opposition is received in writing before the start of the second day of the session period (not the start of the sitting) from 10% of the members of the European Parliament from at least 3 political groups, in which case the President will announce this opposition at the beginning of the second sitting of the session period and the report will be entered on the agenda of the session in question or the following session and dealt with under the normal procedure. The President will set a deadline for the submission of amendments.?
