## EP Rules of procedure, rule 135 and Annex VI: responsibilities of the Committee on Petitions

The committee adopted unanimously the draft decision amending Rule 161 of Parliament's Rules of Procedure concerning the work of the Ombudsman, as the current formulation of the Rule is incompatible with Parliament's decision of 9/3/94 on the regulations and general conditions governing the performance of the Ombudsman's duties. The rapporteur, Mr Brian CROWLEY (UPE, IRL), seeks to improve the good relations which exist between the European Ombudsman and its Committee on Petitions.?

## EP Rules of procedure, rule 135 and Annex VI: responsibilities of the Committee on Petitions

In adopting the report by Mr Brian CROWLEY (UPE, Irl) Parliament amended Rule 161 of its Rules of Procedure. This Rule deals with the activities of the Ombudsman. The purpose of this amendment is to improve the relations between the European Ombudsman and the Parliament's Committee on Petitions. The Ombudsman is to inform Parliament of cases of maladministration which he discovers and submit a report to it at the end of each session on the outcome of his inquiries. The Ombudsman is also to inform the committee responsible at its request or be heard by it on his own initiative. ?
