Conservation of fishery resources: technical measures (18th amend. regul. 3094/86/EEC)

This proposal for a regulation aimed to amend for the 18th time Regulation (EEC) No 3094/86 laying down certain technical measures for the conservation of fishery resources. The current regulation aimed to introduce a new system for the management of the fishing effort in Spain and Portugal. This system, which should apply from 1 January 1996, was designed to ensure that there was no increase in the fishing effort and to guarantee the preservation of the existing balances in specific areas in those countries. The amendments related specifically to: - the ban on the use of driftnets for catching tuna in waters under the sovereignty or jurisdiction of Spain or Portugal in ICES sub-areas VIII, IX or X and in CECAF areas, including waters under the sovereignty or jurisdiction of Spain off the Canary Islands; - the ban on the use of purse seines for catching tropical tuna (skipjack, bigeye and longfinned tuna) in waters under the sovereignty or jurisdiction of Portugal in ICES sub-area X north of 36 °30' N and in CECAF areas north of 31 °N and east of 17 °30' W. The regulation should enter into force on 1 January 1996. ?

Conservation of fishery resources: technical measures (18th amend. regul. 3094/86/EEC)

The Council noted with satisfaction the control measures implemented by the Member States concerned with a view to ensuring full compliance with the rules in force. It confirmed the importance it attaches to the Commission exercising even-handed vigilance. It also noted that the proposal to amend the rules in force still did not have the support of a qualified majority. It instructed the Permanent Representatives Committee to continue examining this dossier in the light of today?s discussions.

Parliament approved the proposal for an amendment of the regulation in accordance with the procedure provided for under Article 143 of its Rules of Procedure (procedure without report). ?

Conservation of fishery resources: technical measures (18th amend. regul. 3094/86/EEC)

- OBJECTIVE: to amend for the 18th time Regulation (EEC) No 3094/86 providing for technical measures for the conservation of fishery resources in order to introduce a new system for the management of fishing activities in Spain and Portugal. This system, which is to apply from 01.01.1996, essentially provides for the non-increase of fishing activities in these countries and the preservation of the existing equilibrium in certain specific zones. - SUBSTANCE: The amendments introduced relate specifically to: . the ban on the use of drift nets for catching tuna fish in waters under the sovereignty or jurisdiction of Portugal and Spain, namely those of CECAF and ICES sections VIII, IX, X, including - where Spain is concerned - the waters off the Canary Islands; . the ban on the use of rotating seines for catching tropical tuna (skipjack, bigeye tuna and albacore) in the waters under the sovereignty or jurisdiction of Portugal in the ICES zones X to the north of parallel 36 30' North and in the CECAF zone to the north of parallel 31 North and to the east of meridian 17 30' West. - ENTRY INTO FORCE: 01.01.1996. ?
